One of Giselle's greatest gifts to Oxford County is her ability to bring people together to mobilize-she knows how to make things happen. She is a person with not only great ideas, but the energy and commitment to bring them to action. Countless parents, caregivers, children and youth across Oxford County have benefited from her professional and volunteer efforts. Additionally, many Boards and community tables (e.g.: Oxford County Community Health Centre, Oxford Situation Table, United Way, etc.) have grown and evolved in their work thanks to her efforts. Her commitment to improving the lives of women and children who have suffered abuse shows through the programs she has brought to Oxford such as the Supportive Mothering and the Caring Dads



programs. Giselle created, developed, secured funding, implemented and is coordinating the Children's Aid Society Oxford's Rapid Response Project. By bringing community partners together, they are prioritizing children, youth and families trying to cope with a mental health crisis by securing alternate supports for immediate and meaningful assistance. She shares her passion and concern for the community, always working with a view of developing a collaborative approach to building a healthier community for all.
